

## 2.7 Text and Digit Entry Table

The following tables show you where each letter and punctuation character can be found. Respective character table will be used when corresponding menu language is selected. This will be helpful when storing a name in the phonebook and renaming your handset. In editing mode, a cursor is displayed to indicate the current text entry position. It is positioned at the right of the last character entered.

## Writing Tips:

- 1. Once a character is selected, the cursor will move to the next position after a short pause.
- 2. You can move the cursor within the text by <UP/DOWN> to amend the text entry.
- 3. Press <C> to delete the last character.
- 4. Press and hold <C> to delete the entire text string.

## 3. USING YOUR PHONE

#### 3.1 Make a Call

## 3.1.1 Preparatory Dialing

Enter the phone number and press <TALK ON> or <SPEAKER-PHONE> to dial the number. Press <C> to clear the entry.

#### 3.1.2 Direct Dialing

Press <TALK ON> or <SPEAKERPHONE> to take the line and enter the phone number.

#### 3.1.3 Call from the phonebook

Press <PHONEBOOK> to access the phonebook and press <UP/DOWN> to select the desired phonebook entry.

Press <TALK ON> or <SPEAKERPHONE> to dial out to the selected phonebook entry. Alternatively, press <MENU/OK> to access the phonebook to get the desired phonebook entry.

#### 3.1.4 Call from the Call List

Press <UP> to access the Call List and press <UP/DOWN> to select the desired Call List entry. Press <TALK ON> or <SPEAKERPHONE> to dial out to the selected Call List entry. Alternatively, press <MENU/ OK> to access the Call List from the main menu.

## 3.1.5 Call from the redial list

Press <DOWN> to access the redial list and press <UP/ DOWN> to select the desired redial number. Press <TALK ON> or <SPEAKERPHONE> to dial out to the selected redial number.

#### 3.1.6 Call timer

Your handset automatically times the duration of every call. The call timer will display a few seconds after the call has made. It is shown in hours, minutes and seconds format (HH:MM:SS).

#### 3.2 Answer a Call

If the handset is not on the charging cradle:

When the phone rings, press <TALK ON> / <SPEAKE PHONE> to answer a call. If the handset is on the charging cradle or the base station and if AUTO ANSWER is set to ON:

When the phone rings, pick up the handset to answer a call.

#### 3.3 End a Call

During a call connection, press <TALK OFF> to end the call. OR

Put the handset on the base station to end the call.

#### 3.4 Adjust Earpiece and Handsfree Volume

There are 5 levels (VOLUME 1 to VOLUME 5) to choose from for each of earpiece and handsfree volume.

During a call: Press <UP/ DOWN> to select volume 1-5. The current setting is shown. When you end the call, the setting will remain at the last selected level

## 3.7 Turn on the Keypad Lock

#### 3.8 Redial the last number

You can redial up to 51 of the last numbers called. If you have stored a name in the phonebook to go with the number, the name will be displayed instead. The most recent last number will display at the top of the redial list.

## 3.8.1 Redial a Number from the Redial List

- In idle mode, press <DOWN> to access the redial list. Remarks: If redial entry with name, press <HASH> to view the number.
- 2. Press <UP/DOWN> to browse the redial list.

Note: If there are no numbers in the redial list, the display shows "EMPTY"

## 3.8.2 Store a Redial Number into the Phonebook

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 3.8.1.

#### 3.8.3 Delete a Redial Number

- Press <OK> to confirm.

## 3.8.4 Delete the Entire Redial List

Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 3.8.1.

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select DELETE ALL
- 3. Press <OK> to confirm.
- 4. Press <OK> to confirm again.

#### 3.9 Find the Handset

You can locate the handset by pressing <PAGE> on the base station. All the handsets registered to the base will produce the paging tone and "PAGING" is displayed on the LCD. You can stop the paging by pressing <TALK ON> / <TALK OFF> / <C> / <SPEAKERPHONE> (Only for speakerphone model) on any handset or <PAGE> on the base again.

Note: If there is an incoming call during paging, the phone will ring with the incoming call instead of paging.

## 3.10 Make an Internal Call

This feature is only applicable when there are at least two registered handsets. It allows you to make internal calls, transfer external calls from one handset to another handset and make conference calls. If the called handset is not answered within 60 seconds, the called handset will stop ringing and the calling handset will return to standby mode.

Note: If only one handset is registered to the base station, press <INT> will display "NOT POSSIBLE".

## 3.10.1 Intercom Another Handset

- In idle mode, press <INT> and the registered handsets will display except the calling handset.
- 2. Enter the desired handset number to intercom with.
- The called handset rings and press <TALK ON> on the called handset to establish the internal call.

Note: If two handsets are registered to the base station, press <INT> will connect to another handset immediately.

#### 3.10.2 Call All Handsets

- In idle mode, press <INT> and the registered handsets will display.
- Press <KEY 9> to ring to all registered handsets.

## 3.10.3 Transfer an External Call to another handset

During an external call:

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select INTER-COM.
- Press <OK> to select the desired handset to intercom with.
- The external call is put on hold automatically and the called handset rings.
- Press <TALK ON> on the called handset to establish an internal call.

- Press <TALK OFF> on the calling handset or put the calling handset on the charging cradle to end the current call with the external party.
- 6. The external call is transferred to the called handset.

### 3.10.4 Make a 3-way Conference Call

The conference call feature allows one external call to be shared with two handsets (in intercom). The three parties can share the conversation and no network subscription is required. During an external call:

- 1. Follow Steps 1 to 4 in section 3.10.3.
- Press and hold <STAR> on 2. the calling handset to establish the conference call.

Any handset hangs up during a conference call will leave the other handset still in connection with the external call.

## 4. PRIVATE PHONEBOOK

Your phone can store up to 202 private phonebook entries with names and numbers. Each phonebook entry can have a maximum of 20 digits for the phone number and 12 characters for the name. You can also select different ringtones for your phonebook entries. Phonebook entries are stored alphabetically by name.

## 4.1 Add a New Phonebook Entry

In idle:

- Press <PHONEBOOK> to access the phonebook.
   OR
   Press <MENU> and <UP/
   DOWN> to select PHONE BOOK main menu item and then press <OK> to access the phonebook.
- 2. Press <MENU> to select
- 3. Press <OK> to enter the name.
- Press <OK> to enter the number.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select the desired ringtone for your phonebook entry.
- Press <OK> to store the phonebook entry.

## **4.2 Search a Phonebook Entry** In idle:

- 1. Press <PHONEBOOK> to access the phonebook.
- 2. Enter the first character of the name by multi-tap.

## **4.3 View a Phonebook Entry** In idle:

- Press <PHONEBOOK> to access the phonebook.
- Press <UP/DOWN> to select the desired phonebook entry.

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select VIEW.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to review the name, number and melody of the selected phonebook entry.

Note: If number is more than 12 digits, press <LEFT SOFT KEY> or <RIGHT SOFT KEY> to view the remaining digits.

## **4.4 Edit a Phonebook Entry** In idle:

- 1. Press <PHONEBOOK> to access the phonebook.
- Press <UP/DOWN> to select the desired phonebook entry.
- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select EDIT.
- Press <OK> and the current contents of the selected phonebook entry displays.
- 5. Edit the name and press <OK>.
- 6. Edit the number and press <OK>
- Press <UP/DOWN> to select the ringtone and press <OK> to confirm.

## 4.5 Delete a Phonebook Entry In idle:

- 1. Press <PHONEBOOK> to access the phonebook.
- Press <UP/DOWN> to select the desired phonebook entry.

- 3. Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select **DELETE**.
- 4. Press <OK> to confirm.

## 4.6 Delete the Entire Private Phonebook

- Press <PHONEBOOK> to access the phonebook.
- Press <UP/DOWN> to select the desired phonebook entry.
- 3. Press <MENU> and <UP/
  DOWN> to select **DELETE**ALL
- 4. Press <OK> to confirm.
- 5. Press <OK> to re-confirm.

## 4.7 Check the Phonebook Usage

You can check how many phonebook entries have been occupied in your phone and how many phonebook entries are available for you to store in the phonebook.

- Press <PHONEBOOK> to access the phonebook.
- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select PB STA-TUS.
- 3. Press <OK> to confirm.

# 5. CALLER DISPLAY (NETWORK DEPENDENT)

This feature is available if you have subscribed the Caller Line Identification service with your network service provider. Your phone can store up to 103received calls with date/time information in the Call List. The number will be shown on the LCD when the phone is ringing. If the number matches with one of the entries in your Private Phonebook, the caller's name stored in the private phonebook will be displayed alternatively with the number. The handset will ring with the melody associated with that phonebook entry.

If the caller number is disabled to send caller information, "WITHHELD" will display.

If the caller number is not provided, "OUT OF AREA" will display.

In standby, if three unanswered calls are received, "3 NEW CALLS" will be displayed.

#### 5.1 View the Call List

All received calls are saved in Call List with the latest call putting at the top of the list. When the call list is full, the oldest call will be replaced by a new call. The unanswered call which has not been read is marked with a <\* icon> at the centre of the bottom line of the display.

1. Press <UP> to access the call list.
OR

Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select **CALL LIST**.

- 2. Press <UP/DOWN> to select the desired entry.
- 3. Press <#> to view the caller's number if applicable.

## 5.2 Store a Call List Number into the Phonebook

- Follow Steps 1 and 2 in Section 5.1
- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ADD TO PB.
- 3. Press <OK> to enter the name.
- 4. Press <OK> and the selected call list number is displayed.
- 5. Edit the number if necessary.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select the melody.
- 7. Press <OK> to confirm.

## 5.3 Delete an entry in the Call List

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in Section 5.1
- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select DELETE.
- Press <OK> to confirm.

## 5.4 Delete the entire list of the Call List

- Follow Steps 1 and 2 in Section 5.1
- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select DELETE All

- 3. Press <OK> to confirm.
- 4. Press <OK> to re-confirm.

## 5.5 View the Details of the Call List Entry

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in Section 5.1
- 2. Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select **DETAILS**.
- 3. Press <OK> to display the date and time of the selected call list entry.
- 4. Press <OK> to go back to previous screen.

# 6. VOICE MAIL (NETWORK DEPENDENT)

Voice Mail Waiting Indication (VMWI) <VMWI icon> is an indication given to you when a new voice mail message is waiting on the network service provider. This feature is available if you have subscribed to the voicemail service from you network service provider. You can press and hold <Key 1> to dial out to the voice mail number directly to listen to your voice mail messages.

- 6.1 Access Voice Mail Messages <VMWI icon> will display and the VMWI entry is stored in the Call List when you have new message in your voice mailbox.
- Press <MENU> and <UP/
   DOWN> to select CALL LIST.
   OR
   Press <UP> in idle to access
   the call list

- 2. Press <UP/DOWN> to select the desired VMWI entry.
- 3. Press <TALK ON> to dial out to the voice mail server.

Note: If a more recent VMWI entry is received from the same network server number of an existing VMWI entry, the new VMWI will not be stored but the date/time of the VMWI will be updated on the existing VMWI entry. After you have accessed to all new voice mail messages, VMWI will turn off automatically. When the call list is full, the new VMWI entry will replace the oldest non-VMWI entry in the call list.

### 6.2 Delete VMWI Entries

## To delete a single VMWI entry from the call list:

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select CALL LIST.
   OR Press <UP> in idle to access the call list
- Press <UP/DOWN> to select the desired VMWI entry.
- 3. Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select **DELETE**.
- 4. Press <OK> to confirm.

To delete all VMWI entries from the call list: To delete a single VMWI entry from the call list:

 Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select CALL LIST. OR Press <UP> in idle to access the call list 2. Press and hold <Key 4> to delete all VMWI entries. The <VMWI icon> will disappear.

Note: If you choose DELETE ALL function in the call list, the handset will also delete all VMWI entries and CID entries.

## 7. PHONE SETTINGS

Your phone comes with a selection of settings that you can change to personalize your phone the way you like it to work.

#### 7.1 Date and Time Settings

You will need to set the correct time and date so that you know when you received answering machine (applicable to model with answering machine) or call list entries.

## 7.1.1 Change the Date Format

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select HS SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select DATE & TIME.
- 3. Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select DATE FORMAT.
- Press <UP/DOWN> to select your desired date format (DD-MM-YY or MM-DD-YY).
- 5 Press < OK > to confirm

## 7.1.2 Change the Time Format

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select HS SET-TINGS
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select DATE & TIMF
- 3. Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select TIME FORMAT
- Press < UP/DOWN > to select your desired time format (12 HR or 24 HR).
- 5. Press <OK> to confirm.

## 7.1.3 Set the Time

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select HS SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select DATE & TIME.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select SET TIME
- Press <OK> to enter the time information. The time entered will be in the format you set in Section 7.1.2
- 5. Press <OK> to confirm.

Note: If time has been set before, the current time will display, otherwise, "HH:MM" will display.

#### 7.1.4 Set the Date

 Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select HS SET-TINGS.

- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select DATE & TIME.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select SET DATE.
- Press <OK> to enter the date information. The date entered will be in the format you set in Section 7.1.1
- 5 Press < OK > to confirm.

Note: If date has been set before, the current date will display, otherwise, "DD-MM-YY" will display.

#### 7.2 Alarm Settings

You can use this phone to set an alarm clock. When an alarm is set, the <ALARM Icon> displays on the LCD.

When the alarm time is reached, the <ALARM icon> and "ALARM ON" flash on the LCD ringing with the alarm melody for a duration of 45 seconds. You can press any key to disable the alarm. If snooze function is activated, the alarm will sound again at the end of the snooze period of seven minutes. You can also press and hold <TALK OFF> to terminate the snooze function.

#### Note:

a. Key press is still applicable if handset keypad is locked and when the alarm time is reached. b. The alarm volume level is the same as the settings of the handset ringer volume. If the handset ringer is set to VOL-UME OFF, the alarm still sounds at VOLUME 1 level.

c. During an external call or

internal call, if an alarm is set and when the alarm time is reached, the <ALARM icon> and "ALARM ON" will still flash. An alarm tone will be emitted from the earpiece to notify user the alarm time is reached. Once user press any key or press and hold <TALK OFF> to disable the alarm, it will revert to the call duration screen.

d. During paging or ringing, the alarm will not sound when the alarm time is reached. However, if snooze function is enabled, the alarm will sound again at the end of the snooze period provided that it's not ringing or in paging mode at the end of the snooze period.

#### 7.2.1 Turn on/off the Alarm

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select HS SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ALARM.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ON/OFF.
- Press <OK> to confirm.

Note: If **ON** is selected, you will be asked to set the alarm time.

## 7.2.2 Set the Alarm Time (if the Alarm is set to be ON)

- 1. Follow Steps 1 to 4 in Section 7 1 1
- 2. Enter the alarm time in the time format you set in Section 7.1.2
- 3. Press <OK> to set the snooze function.

- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ON or OFF.
- 5. Press <OK> to confirm.

## 7.3 Handset Settings 7.3.1 Set the Ringer Melody for Internal Calls

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select HS SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select RING SETUP.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select INT RING.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select the desired ringer melody (a total of 5 melodies for your selection) for setting ringer melody for internal calls. (Notes: a total of 10 melodies for selection in speakerphone model).
  - Note: The respective ringer melody will be played while browsing the melody list.
- Press <OK> to confirm.

### 7.3.2 Set the Ringer Melody for External Calls

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select HS SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select RING SETUP.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select EXT RING.

- 4. Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select the desired ringer melody (a total of 10 melodies for your selection) for setting ringer melody for external calls. Note: The respective ringer melody will be played while browsing the melody list.
- 5. Press <OK> to confirm.

## 7.3.3 Set the Ringer Melody for External Calls

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select HS SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select RING SETUP.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select RING VOLUME.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select the desired ringer volume (a total of 6 ringer volume levels including VOLUME OFF). Note: The respective ringer volume will be played during your selection. If VOLUME OFF is selected, <Ringer Off> icon will display.
- 5. Press <OK> to confirm.

#### 7.3.4 Set Alert Tones

A single beep is emitted when you press a key. You can turn on or off the key tone. You can also turn on the alert tones when low battery and out of range are detected. Low battery tone will be emitted while you are talking with the phone to alert you

that you need to charge up your battery.

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select HS SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select TONE SETUP.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select KEY TONE / BATTERY TONE / OUT OF RANGE.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to turn on or off these tones.
- 5. Press <OK> to confirm.

## 7.3.5 Set the Handset Language

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select HS SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select LAN-GUAGE.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select the desired language.
- 4. Press <OK> to confirm.

#### 7.3.6 Rename the Handset

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select HS SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select RENAME HS.
- Press <OK> and enter the name of your handset.

4. Press <OK> to confirm.

## 7.3.7 Choose the Information to be Displayed in Idle

You can choose to display time or handset name in your idle screen.

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select HS SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select HS DIS-PLAY
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select HAND-SET NAME or TIME.
- 4. Press <OK> to confirm.

## 7.3.8 Set the Auto Answer

If you turn on the Auto Answer, you can pick up the call from the cradle without pressing any key.

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select HS SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select AUTO ANSWER.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to turn on or off the auto answer feature.
- Press <OK> to confirm.

#### 7.4 Base Settings

The current settings are marked an asterisk which is displayed at the rightmost of the menu item.

## 7.4.1 Set the Base Ringer Melody (Optional)

 Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select BS SET-TINGS.

- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select BS RING-ER.
- 3. Press <OK> and <UP/
  DOWN> to select the desired ringer melody (a total
  of 5 melodies for your selection)
  Note: The respective ringer
  melody will be played while
  browsing the melody list.
- 4. Press <OK> to confirm.

## 7.4.2 Set the Ringer Volume (Optional)

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select BS SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select RING VOLUME.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select the desired ringer volume (a total of 6 ringer volume levels including VOLUME OFF). Note: The respective ringer volume will be played during your selection.
- Press <OK> to confirm.

## 7.4.3 De-register a Handset

You are requested to enter the 4-digit PIN in order to de-register a handset from the base station. The antenna icon on the de-registered handset will blink. Note: You cannot de-register the handset that you are currently using.

 Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select BS SET-TINGS.

- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select **DELETE HS**.
- Press <OK> and you are requested to enter the 4-digit system PIN.
- Enter the 4-digit system PIN.
   Press <OK> and a list of registered handsets is displayed.
- 5. Press <UP/DOWN> to select one of the handsets that you want to de-register.
- 6. Press <OK> to confirm.

## 7.4.4 Change the dial mode

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select BS SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select DIAL MODE.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select TONE or PULSE.
- 4. Press <OK> to confirm.

## 7.4.5 Change the Flash Time

The flash time settings is country dependent. Please contact your local service provider for the correct settings.

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select BS SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select FLASH TIME.

 Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select your desired flash time (SHORT, ME-DIUM, LONG).

Press <OK> to confirm.

## 7.4.6 Change the System PIN Code

A 4-digit system PIN code is used for changing the system settings of the base station. It is used to protect your phone against unauthorized use. The default system PIN code is 0000.

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select BS SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select CHANGE PIN.
- Press <OK> and you are requested to enter the 4-digit system PIN.
- 4. Enter the old system PIN.
- Press <OK> and enter the new system PIN.
- Press <OK> and enter the new system PIN again. Note: If the new PIN entered in Step 6 is not matched with the new system PIN entered in Step 5, user is requested to enter the valid system PIN again in Step 5.
- 7. Press <OK> to confirm.

## 7.5 Registration

Your handset and base station is pre-registered. Up to five handsets can be registered to a single base station.

If for some reason, the handset is not registered to the base station (<Antenna icon> flashes even when the handset is near the base station), register your handset according to the following procedure.

- Press and hold <PAGE> on the base station for about five seconds, the base station is entered into registration mode.
- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select REGIS-TRATION.
- Press <OK> and you are requested to enter the 4-digit system PIN.
- 4. Enter the 4-digit system PIN.
- 5. Press <OK> to confirm.

If the handset registration is successful, you will hear a confirmation tone and the <antenna icon> will stop flashing.

The handset will automatically be allocated the next available handset number. This handset number is shown in the handset display in standby mode. If the handset registration is unsuccessful, the <antenna icon> will still flash.

#### 7.6 Reset Your Phone

You can reset your phone to the default settings. After reset, all you personal settings and call

list entries will be deleted, but your phonebook remains unchanged.

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select DEFAULT.
- Press <OK> and you are requested to enter the 4-digit system PIN.
- 3. Enter the 4-digit system PIN.
- Press <OK> to confirm.
- 5. Press <OK> to re-confirm.

## 8. ANSWERING MACHINE

The answering machine feature is only available on certain models within our range. Please contact your authorised dealer for further details

Your phone includes a telephone answering machine that records unanswered calls when it is on. The LED message counter (two digits seven segment display) on the base will show the number of the messages when the answering machine is on. The answering machine can store up to 59 messages within the maximum recording time of approximately 15 minutes. As well as recording incoming messages, you can record memos for other users of your phone. If the answering machine memory is full, the Handset will display TAM FULL and the handset name alternatively in standby, or display TAM FULL and the date/ time information in standby which depends onwhich kind of information (Handset name or Date/Time – See Section 1.33.7) is selected to display in Standby.

## 8.1 Turn On/Off the Answering Machine

You can turn on or off the answering machine through the base or handset. When the answering machine is set to ON, calls will be answered after the set answer delay and the caller can then leave you a message. When the answering machine is set to OFF, calls will be answered after 10 rings and the answer only message will be played to your callers. They will not be able to leave you a message.

## Through the Base:

- Press <TAM ON/OFF> on the base station.
- If answering machine is set to ON, <TAM ON icon> displays on the handset LCD and the 7-seg LED on the base station will display the number of incoming messages.
- If answering machine is set to OFF, <TAM ON icon> will disappear from the handset LCD and the 7-seg LED on the base station will display -.

## Through the Handset:

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANS. MA-CHINE.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select TAM ON/ OFF.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ON or OFF.

4 Press <OK> to confirm.

- If answering machine is set to ON, <TAM ON icon> displays on the handset LCD and the 7-seg LED on the base station will display the number of incoming messages.

- If answering machine is set to OFF, <TAM ON icon> will disappear from the handset LCD and the 7-seg LED on the base station will display - -.

tion will display - -.

8.2 Listen to the Messages in the Answering Machine

When new messages are recorded on the answering machine, <TAM Icon> flashes on the handset display and the message counter on base flashes with the number of new messages in the answering machine until all the new messages are played. Old messages will be played after all new messages are played completely. The message counter LED stays steady to indicate the number of old messages stored in the answering machine.

## Listen new messages through the Base:

- Press <PLAY> on the base station.
- The new messages are 2. played from the loudspeaker on the base station in the sequence they are recorded.
- Press <+> or <-> to increase or decrease the volume during message playback respectively.

Note: If there are no new messages, "00" will display steadily in the message counter on the base. Press <PLAY> will have no effect and an alert tone is emitted

## Listen new messages through the Handset:

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANS. MA-CHINE.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select MSG PLAYBACK.
- Press <OK> to start message playback and the screen displays the date and time information of the message received.

Note: <STAR icon> is placed at the centre of the bottom of the LCD to indicate that it is a new message. If this message has been read or listened, the <STAR icon> will disappear and will be reflected next time when you listen to this message again. Note: If there are no new messages, "00" will display steadily in the message counter on the base. Press <OK> to display "00--00 00--00" and return back to ANS. MACHINE menu.

 During message playback, press <UP> or <DOWN> to increase or decrease the message playback volume respectively.

Note: After new message is played, the new message will be saved as an old message automatically unless it is deleted.  Press <MENU> to select STOP, FORWARD, PREVI-OUS, DELETE to perform the following functions during message playback.

STOP: Stop the current message playback and return to the ANS. MACHINE menu. FORWARD: Skip to play the next message. The date and time information of the next message will display if there is next message.

PREVIOUS: Škip to repeat playing the current message from the beginning. The date and time information of the current message will display.

DELETE: Delete the current message and the next message will be played.

Note: Alternatively, you can use the following shortcut keys to control different operation during message playback

Press <Key 5> to stop message playback.

Press < Key 4> to skip to repeat playing the current message from the beginning. Press < Key 4> twice to skip backward to the previous message.

Press < Key 6> to skip to play next message.

Press <Key 2> to delete the current message playback.

- 6. Press <OK> to confirm.
- 8.3 Delete All Messages in the Answering Machine

Delete all messages through the Base:

In idle:

- 1. Press and hold <DELETE> on the base station.
- All the old messages will be 2. deleted.
- Note: New messages will not be deleted. If there are no more messages in the answering machine, "00" will display on the base station.

## Delete all messages through the Handset:

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANS. MA-CHINE.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select DELETE ALL.
- 3. Press <OK> to confirm.
- 4. Press <OK> to delete all old messages.
  - Note: If there are no more messages in the answering machine, "EMPTY" will display and return back to ANS. MACHINE menu.

#### 8.4 Record Memo

You can record your memo message for another user. When you record a memo, the message counter will increase by one and the message can be played back in the same way as answering machine messages. Memo recording can still function even when the answering machine is turned off.

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANS. MA-CHINE.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select MEMO.

- Press <OK> to start memo recording and "RECORD-ING" is displayed.
- Press <OK> to stop memo recording and save the memo.
   OR
   Press <C> to stop memo recording without saving and return back to ANS. MA-CHINE menu.

## 8.5 Answering Machine Settings

You can use the TAM SETTINGS menu through the handset to change the settings of your answering machine.

## 8.5.1 Set the Answer Mode

By default, the answer machine is set in ANS & REC mode which allows callers to leave a message. This mode can be changed to ANSWER ONLY which does not allow callers to leave a message. In that case, your callers will be prompted to call back later.

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANS. MA-CHINE.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select TAM SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANSWER MODE.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANS & REC or ANSWER ONLY.
- 5. Press <OK> to confirm.

# 8.5.2 Set the Outgoing Message Language (Country Dependent)

The answering machine announces the outgoing message when it answers a call. There is a pre-set OGM for each of ANS & REC mode or ANSWER ONLY mode. You are able to select your desired OGM language to playback.

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANS. MA-CHINE
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select TAM SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select TAM LAN-GUAGE.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select your desired OGM language.
- Press <OK> to confirm.

## 8.5.3 Record Your Own Outgoing Message (OGM)

You can record your own OGM for ANS & REC mode or ANS-SWER ONLY mode. When you record your own OGM, it will be used when the answering machine answers the call. If your personalized OGM is deleted, the preset OGM will be restored automatically.

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANS. MA-CHINE.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select TAM SET-TINGS.

- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select OGM SETTINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANS & REC or ANSWER ONLY.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select RECORD MESS.
- Press <OK> to start recording your personalized OGM and "RECORDING" is displayed on the screen.
- Press < OK> to stop and save your personalized OGM.
   Your newly saved OGM will playback automatically. Alternatively, press < BACK icon> to return to previous screen without saving the personalized OGM.

## 8.5.4 Playback and Delete the Outgoing Message (OGM)

You can playback your own personalized OGM or the pre-set OGM for ANS & REC mode or ANSWER ONLY mode and choose to delete your personalized OGM during playback and record a new one whenever you want. Please note that pre-set OGM cannot be deleted.

## 8.5.4.1 Playback the OGM

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANS. MA-CHINE.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select TAM SET-TINGS.

- 3. Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select **OGM SETTINGS**
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANS & REC or ANSWER ONLY.
- 5. Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select PLAY-BACK.
- Press <OK> to playback your personalized OGM (if you have recorded a personalized OGM before) and "PLAYGING OGM" is displayed on the screen.
- Press <OK> to stop the OGM playback and return to the previous menu. Note: If a personalized OGM is not recorded before, the pre-set OGM will be played.

### 8.5.4.2 Delete the Personalized OGM

- 1. Repeat Steps 1 to 6 in Section 8.5.4.1
- Press <C> to delete your personalized OGM and return to previous menu and the pre-set OGM is restored automatically.

Note: If pre-set OGM is playing, you are not allowed to delete the pre-set OGM and thus <C icon> will not display. Only <OK icon> will display.

8.5.5 Set the Answer Delay

You can set the number of rings before the answering machine answers and starts playing your OGM. You can set the answering machine to answer after two to eight rings or TIME SAVER.

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANS. MA-CHINE.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select TAM SET-TINGS.
- Press < OK> and < UP/ DOWN> to select ANSWER DELAY (Available options: 2 RINGS, 4 RINGS, 6 RINGS, 8 RINGS or TIME SAVER).
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select your desired answer delay.
- 5. Press <OK> to confirm.

# 8.5.6 Set the Recording Time of Incoming Message

You can set the maximum length of the recording time of the incoming messages.

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANS. MA-CHINE.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select TAM SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select RECORD TIME (Available options: 60S, 120S, 180S, or UNLIM-ITED).
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select your desired recording time.
- 5. Press <OK> to confirm.

# 8.5.7 Turn On or Off the Base Screening

You can select to turn on or off the call screening on base through the TAM SETTINGS menu on your handset.

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANS. MACHINE.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select TAM SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select SCREEN-ING.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ON or OFF.
- 5. Press <OK> to confirm.

### 8.5.8 Change the Compression Rate

Three different compression rates (HIGH, MID and LOW) are provided for you to select different quality levels of recording in message. The lower the compression rate, the higher the recording quality level attained.

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANS. MA-CHINE.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select TAM SET-TINGS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select COM-PRESSION.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select your desired compression rate.

5. Press <OK> to confirm.

#### 8.5.9 Activate Remote Access

Your phone lets you check your messages, or otherwise operate your answering machine, by calling the answering machine when you are away from home by entering a 4-digit remote access PIN on a tone-dialing phone. Use the 4-digit remote access PIN code to prevent other people from unauthorized access of your answering machine.

#### 8.5.9.1 Change the 4-Digit Remote Access PIN

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANS. MA-CHINE.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select TAM SET-TINGS.
- 3. Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select CHANGE PIN.
- Press < OK> to enter the Old PIN. (Default Remote Access PIN is 0000).
- 5. Press <OK> to enter the New PIN.
- Press <OK> to enter the New PIN again.
   Note: If the new PIN entered in Step 6 is not matched with the new system PIN entered in Step 5, user is requested to enter the valid system PIN again in Step 5.
- 7. Press <OK> to reconfirm.

### 8.5.9.2 Activate or Deactivate the Remote Access

- Press <MENU> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ANS. MA-CHINE
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select TAM SET-TINGS.
- 3. Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select **REMOTE** ACCESS.
- Press <OK> and <UP/ DOWN> to select ON or OFF to turn on or off the remote access respectively.
- Press <OK> to confirm.

### 8.5.9.3 Access Your Answering Machine Remotely

You can ring your Chamfer from another tone-dialing phone to switch on or off the answering machine and listen to your messages remotely.

- 1. Place a call from a tone-dialing phone to your **Chamfer**.
- When the answering machine answers the calls and starts playing the OGM, press <KEY \*>.

Note: Enter the \* while OGM is still playing and proceed the following in order to access the answering machine remotely.

Enter the 4-digit Remote Access PIN.

Note: If the 4-digit Remote Access PIN is entered incorrectly three times consecutively, the line will be released automatically. 4. Press the following keys to carry out your desired function.

- 5 Stop the current message playback
- 6 Skip to play the next message
- 8 Stop the current message playback

Note: If your answering machine is switched off, the phone will enter into the remote access mode after 10 rings.

You can then enter the 4-digit remote access PIN (Default Remote Access PIN is 0000) to activate the remote access feature. When your answering machine memory is full and the answer mode is in ANS & RECORD, the answer mode will change to ANSWER ONLY automatically. It will change to ANS & RECORD mode automatically after some messages have been deleted.

#### 8.5.10 Call Screening

When the answering machine is set to ON and when there is an incoming message, the base will start call screening automatically after the preset numbers of rings of answer delay. At any time if you want to pick up the call, you can press <TALK ON> on the handset and the message recording will be stopped automatically. If the answering machine is in the process of recording, the message already stored will be saved.
